Printed wrappers, 8vo, [3], 100 pp. From the introduction: "The Historia Brittonum Is one of the most important collections of documents relating to early British history. Drawn together early in the ninth century, its contents are of varying date, composition and purpose and it is to be used with caution. Nevertheless, no student of early British history should be without a copy. This long-overdue new edition presents the Latin text of the Historia and the Annales Cambriae, with a translation and notes. The historical concept of Nennius' compilation is original and startlingly modern. Almost all ancient, medieval and early modern historians undertook narrative histories giving their own interpretation of their sources. Nennius did not. In his own words, he 'made a heap of all he found'. In deciding to publish extracts and abridgements of his sources, rather than a history, supplied with such editorial notes and dating as he was able to provide, he accepted a modest target, within the limits of the knowledge at his disposal. His decision was without precedent and for long without sequel. It gave to posterity an insight into the history of Britain...
