Previous to that year 12 oz. of standard silver, containing 11 oz. 2 dwts. of pure silver, and 18 dwts. alloy, were by law to be coined into 62 shillings; but in that year an Act was passed making only gold coin legal tender in all payments of more than 40s., and providing that the pound or 12 ounces troy of standard silver should be coined into 66 shillings, giving to the State, as seignorage, the difference between the market price of silver of the Mint standard, and 5s. d. per ounce. Before the passing of this Act (56 Geo. III., c. 68) silver coin of standard weight and fineness was a legal tender to the amount of 25/. The market price of silver has not been such since the year 1816 as to afford any temptation...
