What distinguishes it most of all is the startling originality of Chevillard's voice and vision. There is whimsy and despair in this novel, pathos and laughter, satire and warm affection. "The Crab Nebula" is the fifth novel - and the first to be translated into English - by the brilliant young French author Eric Chevillard.
